

Hi Kampers,

I've had a few questions about what to bring, so I assembled the list below. Use it as a guideline to inform your packing. The weather looks fair (see below). I expect that if it does rain, it could be squalls, which can be locally intense and you could be a ways away from cover. Plan to carry raingear, water, food, collecting gear to get you through the day.

Packing list for OR coast

- Sleeping bag/pillow
- Tent, tarp, sleeping pad if camping
- Raingear (preferably with hood), include a b-ball cap to keep face dry
I prefer the coated nylon loggers rain gear esp. the bibs, available at saw shops (we might pass some).
- Warm insulation that will be warm when wet, think about your legs too.
- Good waterproof footwear
- Light gloves
- Comfortable hiking socks
- Collecting bucket, tools, and containers
- Hand lens
- Stuff to put your specimens into, for the frig
- Texts, notebooks (lecture, lab, field)
- Clipboard or other arrangement to take notes without a table
- Writing implements and field notebook that will work in wet conditions
I use a Rite in the rain with a pencil
- Digital cameras are nice, esp with macro and small tripod (bring h-d zip-loc)
- Day pack/fanny pack to hold lunch plus your lichen book
- Water bottle
- Small thermos & personal mug
- Food—pack your food in produce boxes & coolers (easy to pack), pack with friends, and clearly label your boxes. Go to the Farmers market and scope the boxes
- Personal gear
- Camp shoes
- All items in supply list from syllabus
- Musical instruments
- Other suitable recreational gear aqueous, those attractive nuisances)
- Tweezers and dissecting probes have them
- Clothing appropriate for forecast (see above)

In addition to the texts, you will need the following items:

- WATCH
- Field notebook
- Lab notebook (3 ring binder with lined and unlined paper)
- Hand lens (10x)
- Colored pencils for drawings in lab
- Good quality drawing pencils

- Compass (suitable for taking a bearing)
- Whistle
- Sharp forceps
- Rain gear
- Collecting equipment (will give details during first week)
